Even if you do not plan to submit an abstract, please save the date and join us to learn about some outstanding new research!

Camp Resources Presentation Formats & Travel Support

Camp Resources is a workshop designed for graduate students and young professionals to present their research in a relaxed but serious environment. We do not expect a paper. However, a clear, well-organized, twenty-minute presentation describing a completed or emerging research project has been standard fare. This year's Camp will also include shorter research sketches. These sketches are ideal for students in the early stages of dissertation work. Through the generous support of the *Journal of Environmental Economics and Management*, *Industrial Economics*, and *Resources for the Future*, we will again be able to defray travel expenses for those giving regular presentations and, in a more limited way, those giving research sketches.

All graduate students, young professionals and faculty are invited to attend! A modest registration fee will be charged to all attendees.

Submission Information

Abstract submissions for regular presentations or research sketches must be submitted via email to enviro_econ@ncsu.edu **no later than noon on Friday, May 4, 2018**. Submissions must adhere to the following guidelines:

Email subject line must read: CAMP RESOURCES

Abstract File Format: The file must be in pdf or MS Word format.

Abstract File Contents:

- i) Title of Presentation/Paper
- ii) Authors Name(s)
- iii) Presenter's Name
- iv) Presenter's Affiliation
- v) Presenter's Title (e.g., Ph.D. candidate; Asst. Professor)
- vi) Abstract of no more than 500 words

Additionally, please attach a curriculum vitae (CV) and include the following:

- i) Who is (was) your dissertation advisor?
- ii) Have you defended your dissertation? If not, when do you anticipate defending?
- iii) Are you on the job market this fall?
- iv) Have you presented at Camp Resources in the past? If so, when?

Be sure to indicate your preference for either a regular presentation or sketch in the body of the email. Note that if you indicate a preference for a regular presentation and your abstract is not selected, we will automatically consider it for a sketch unless you tell us otherwise.

We hope to send decision notifications before June 2nd.
